Below is some general information. If you have questions, please call any of the officers listed on previous page.

- 1. We offer meetings several times through the year to which all women are invited. We have a short business meeting, and offer some program or event.
- 2. A free will offering will be received at all Circle meetings. Fifty percent of these offerings are sent to the synod/national office of the WELCA in support of the larger organization and their ministry. We also receive a thank offering (gifts in gratitude for blessings) on Thank Offering Sunday in November for the ministry of WELCA.
- 3. We sponsor events through the year for the purpose of fellowship of our members and for fundraising. The money raised is given at the end of the year to non profit organizations such as Lutheran World Relief, ELCA Missions, The Banquet, and other local charities.
- 4. Anything "charged" at local businesses to be paid from the WCLC treasury needs to have the following documentation: name of person making charge; name of Circle or Committee; date of charge; and purpose for the items charged. One copy of the receipt with the documentation should be left in with the business and a copy placed in the WCLC box in the church office. Thanks.

Prayer Shawl Ministry

A prayer shawl is a wrap that is knitted or crocheted by members of the congregation and then given out to individuals as a gift of encouragement and support. Size of standard quilts made is 60 inches by 80 inches. Many of the quilts are donated to Lutheran World Relief, Food Shelf, Native American Mission and Local Missions and needs.

Cradle Roll

Cradle Roll is a program that helps parents nurture the faith of their very young children. These families receive a packet of resource information when their child is born, and continue to receive written information periodically until the child is age 3 and ready to start Sunday School. Included are a number of spiritual helps for the child's growth in love for Jesus. Thanks to Kathy Wurpts for facilitating this program for many years.

Duties of WCLC Officers

President:

- 1. Write circle letters each month
- 2. Preside over board meetings
- 3. Work with WCLC board to revise handbooks, assemble and distribute for coming year.
- 4. Attend Executive Church Council meeting the 2nd Wednesday of the month. Write a report to be placed in the Council minutes. Find replacement if unable to attend.

Vice President:

- 1. Preside at meetings in absence of President
- 2. Be responsible for advertising WCLC events
- 3. Wrap and deliver cook books to new brides
- 4. Facilitate planning calendar events for coming year

Secretary:

- 1. Keep written records of each board meeting
- 2. Make a written report for the congregational Annual Report at the end of the year
- 3. Take care of correspondence such as thank you's.

Treasurer:

- 1. Provide monthly written report of income, expenditures and balance on hand
- 2. Collect all Circle offerings from the office safe and deposit in the bank
- 3. Send 50% of all offerings to the Synod WELCA. Also send offerings as decided by the board to the conventions and workshops. Pay bills as required.
 - A. Profits from any fundraising event a minimum of 10% to be given to outside missions.
 - B. February Gift to local Food Shelves
- 4. Make year end report for the congregational Annual Report
- 5. Order Gather magazine for New Members (one year subscription) and 3 for Library. Consult with Office Manager for new members.

Mission Action:

- 1. Organize quilting work days and assemble in-kind offerings through the year
- 2. Keep records of number of quilts completed and donated, and of other projects completed
- 3. Keep record of places that receive quilts, contact people, and transportation arrangements

Mission Growth:

- 1. Organize programs for special events such as Thank offering Sunday and World Day of Prayer (every 7 years) along with the officers
- 2. Communicate with Pastors regarding Bible Study leadership

Mission Community:

- 1. Put Birthday cards in mailboxes monthly
- 2. Provide suggestions for community outreach
- 3. Organize Sonshine in Summer and have names and addresses of people to be visited

Circle Chairpersons:

Preside over Circle meeting and facilitate the following:

- 1. Arrange for Bible study leaders and hostesses each month;.
- 2. Read WCLC President's letter at Circle
- 3. Schedule meals on wheels workers when requested
- 4. Attend WCLC Board meetings.
- 5. Put offering in safe with Circle name and date.
