Dear Christ Lutheran members and friends,

As I am typing up my April newsletter, I woke up on March 26th with Cynthia, my wife, telling me, 'Chad you are going to need more than a shovel this morning, you better see if the snowblower works!' I thought my lovely Cynthia was joking as I got out of bed, so I looked out the window, and saw that she was correct, like usual! I kissed her put on my snow gear and went outside to the beautiful Christmas-looking weather!

This unexpected snowstorm that was a few days late, and reminded me of Jesus rising three days after his crucifixion. Was God reminding me when Mary Magdalene went to Jesus' Tomb to anoint Him with oils, when she found the tomb to be empty? She would run back to tell the disciples and the disciples were like, 'Are you kidding us, Mary? Is this some type of joke?' The disciples would run to the tomb and see if Mary was telling the truth. And to their confusion, she was telling the truth. The disciples were uncertain about what to do and went back home. As the disciples left, Jesus would appear to Mary as she was crying. Jesus spoke to her and then she knew it was Jesus. I am sure she sprinted back to the disciples instead of walking and started spreading the good news of Jesus rising from the dead! (John 20:1-18)

Do you ever have those unexpected 'God Moments' in your life when out of nowhere you feel the Lord's presence as He is guiding you through maybe a challenging time - like breaking your arm on the ice or finding out you have some type of cancer, or maybe a very joyous time with a newborn baby or grand-baby, or seeing you have just retired after many decades in a certain career? I have definitely been on both sides of the spectrums of great sadness, but also utter joy and amazement at what God has handed me. But you know what with 'Jesus Everywhere' in our lives, we hopefully feel at peace with God regardless of our circumstances.

As our Lenten season is now behind us along with our Holy Week and Easter - we go into the Pentecost season and you may ask yourself, 'Pastor Chad, what does the Pentecost season truly mean?' Well, I will tell you, the Pentecost is the beginning of the Christian Church. That is why Pentecost is also called the birthday of the Church. The story of the Pentecost miracle tells us that God is present in the world again. Just as God was present in His son Jesus, God is now present through His Holy Spirit. This brings me great peace and reassurance that He is with us all the time and everywhere we go!

Back on Valentine's of 2023, Cynthia gave me a baby blue book titled, **Trade Your Cares for Calm** by Max Lucado, that lays on my desk, and as I sat down in my comfortable black office chair in the church, I picked this book up, that I do every morning, and read Chapter 1 - *Face Fear and Anxiety*. The author wrote, 'Anxiety comes with life. But it doesn't have to dominate your life.' Well said, Max!

Have you ever found yourself so worried you can't even get out of bed in the morning, but then as the day progresses that worry you had wasn't as bad as you thought or never came to be a a reality? As Apostle Paul was in prison, again, for his faith in Jesus Christ knowing at any moment he might be killed for his belief, he would pen the following from Philippians 4:4-7, '**4** Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! **5** Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. **6** Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. **7** And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.'

Max Lucado went on in his small baby blue book with these wise words, 'Rather than becoming overwhelmed and immobilized or hypervigilant and controlling, we can stress less when we remember three things -

1. Gather the Facts - What are the odds the things you are worrying about will ever occur?

2. Control what you can control - Once you know precisely the challenges that you face, make a list of what you can do about them.

3. Don't second guess yourself - Make the best decision you can with the facts at hand, and live with it. Pray and take the next step.

As we begin this month of April and the Pentecost season, may we all give our cares and worries to the Lord as King Solomon reminds us in Proverbs 16:9, 'We plan the way we want to live but only God makes us able to live it.' So God must have wanted me to plow this Tuesday morning and as I was plowing the enormous drifts out on the driveway and sidewalk, I had an amazing helper, Cynthia, come out and take my hand and finish the job! We are a 'Family of God' who are all always looking out for each other and caring for everyone's needs!

May you all have those 'God Moments' in April and throughout this 2024 year!

....from your Parish Nurse: April is Parkinson's Awareness Month

What is Parkinson's disease: Parkinson's is a neurodegenerative disorder that affects predominately dopamine-producing neurons in a specific area of the brain called substantia nigra.

Early Symptoms: Symptoms generally develop slowly over years.

- 1) Tremors-A tremor while at rest in fingers, thumb, hand, or chin.
- 2) Handwriting changes-Smaller and crowded handwriting.
- 3) Loss of smell-Have you noticed you cannot smell some things like bananas, dill pickle or licorice.
- 4) Trouble sleeping-Increased movement during sleep, which becomes a nightly occurrence.
- 5) Trouble moving or walking-Stiffness or feeling like your "feet are stuck to the floor".
- 6) Soft or low voice-If others notice your voice getting quieter or hoarse.
- 7) Mask face-If you have a serious, depressed, or mad look on your face even if you are in good mood.
- 8) Dizziness or Fainting-Not associated with low blood pressure.
- 9) Stooping or hunching over-Not associated with injury or osteoporosis.

What you can do if you have Parkinson's

Work with your physician to create a plan to stay healthy. This may include:

- * Referral to neurologist, a doctor that specializes in the brain.
- * Care from an occupational therapist, physical therapist, or speech therapist. Meeting with a medical social worker to talk about how Parkinson's will change your life. The cause remains largely unknown. Although there is no cure, treatment options vary and include medications and surgery. While Parkinson's itself is not fatal, disease complications can be serious. The CDC rated complications from Parkinson's disease as the 14th cause of death in the United States.

The amount you may be required to take is called a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD). The direct transfer will keep your taxable amount lower while allowing you to support your chosen charity. It is recommended to contact your financial advisor or tax advisor for details on the RMD.

The WCLC Board met on Tuesday, February 6th, 2024. The Balance on Hand as of January 31, 2024 in the Treasury is \$1,568.45 and \$1,179.81 of this amount is designated for specific projects leaving an actual balance of \$388.65. Committee reports were given and placed on file. Mission Action Committee gave a detailed report on their work this month. They reported that the quilters have moved into their newly renovated and larger room now and are loving it. Donations to date are \$4,640.82 and since flooring expenses were more than anticipated, they are still in need of about \$1,100.00. They are very thankful for the donations & volunteers toward the project thus far. Mission Community continues to send birthday cards to all women.

Mission Growth is contemplating future programs, especially on health and aging. Ideas were shared.

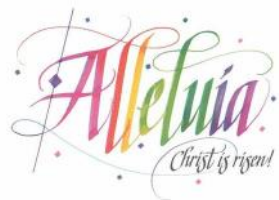

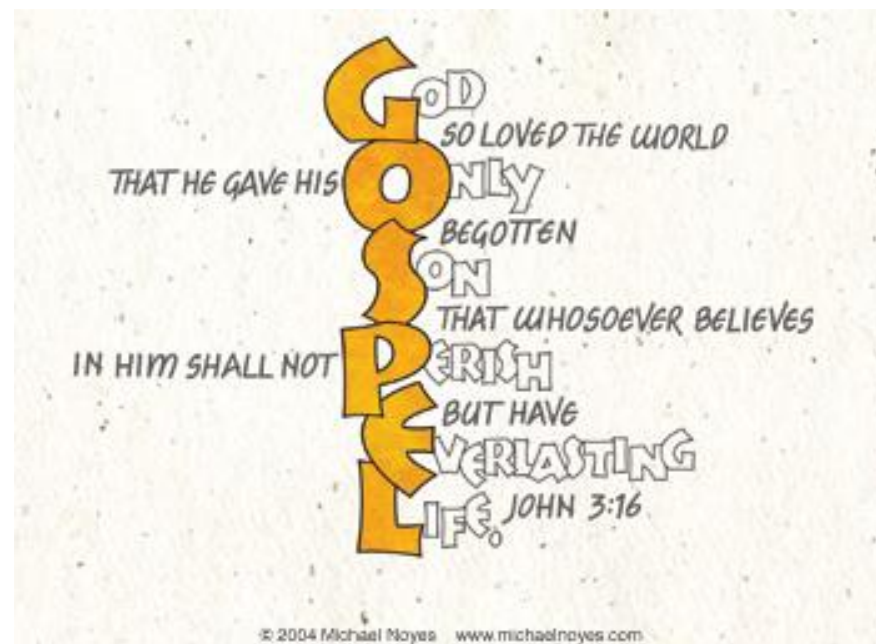
